2	Welcome & Apologies	
	Brian Cassidy, Gemma Hinchliffe, Mary Hurll and Nathan Rickard had sent apologies for this meeting, which were accepted. BH welcomed AW to the Governing Body as a new Parent Governor. Governors introduced themselves.

5	Headteacher's Report - verbal	

	LR updated Governors on the current levels of COVID in the school – 7 positive cases, all pupils. LR reported that staff had been incredible over this term with the high levels of COVID in school, lots of questions from parents and lots of incidents to be dealt with. Office staff particularly have been working very hard. Governors expressed concern at the levels of stress this was putting on staff, particularly LR and offered help whenever needed. LR reported that there has been a lot of prospective parents wanting to visit the school.	
	The Christmas tree is up and staff are trying to make things as normal and fun for the	
	children as usual at this time of year.	
6	Safeguarding	
	BH gave feedback from the Schools and Academies Show that she had attended – nationally there are many concerns over the amount of work from the Government on safeguarding.	
	LR reported that all staff are up-to date with safeguarding training. LR has recently attended Managing Allegations training and GC attended the Safeguarding Forum.	
	Governors asked LR to pass their thanks to Gerry Curran (GC) for the updates that he regularly sends out.	
	LR updated Governors on the Supervision that is taking place in school – Governors asked whether LR feels she personally is receiving adequate supervision – LR reported that this is ongoing and she also attends a very useful local Headteachers group.

	 SC reported that a Yr1 place has just been offered and accepted. That leaves one Yr1 vacancy. September 2022 intake is looking good on the BCP Council website. BH reported on a request to exceed PAN in Yr6 – refused. 2023/24 Admissions Policy – BCP Council had requested that some changes were made to the wording. The changes made were agreed as not material so the policy does not need consultation.
