	LR read Ofsted's draft report following last week's inspection to the Governors. In summary she said, it was very complimentary and she was very proud of the children and the staff.	
	LR advised staff had received a general debrief and a full breakdown of feedback would be provided on a class by class basis. A celebration is planned for staff and children to say well done.	
	Governors reported their session with the Ofsted inspector had been in-depth and thorough.	
	LR advised PP phonics had made good progress this year.	
	Timestables results were in line with last year's high attainment (top 200 schools in England)	
	EYFS cohort have lower outcomes than last year but all children have made progress from their starting points.	
	In addition to Ofsted's inspection last week, Year 6 was moderated by the LA with excellent results. Samples of Year 6 writing have been selected for the Standards and Testing Agency to use across the country. We await Key Stage 2 SATs' results.
