* Understanding of the Temptation of Jesus and the symbolism of Lent.

Looking at ways in which we prepare for Easter to become more like Jesus.

- * Continuing the introduction to the Jewish faith.

English

Our English work this term will be based on our new writing scheme: Talk for Writing.

We will be focussing on a writing warning narrative. We will be using a mixture of drama, retelling through pictures and using short-burst writing, to support us in writing our final narrative.

Reading will be a top priority throughout the term. We will read every day in class both independently and read our class book.

PE

This will normally take place on Wednesday and Friday. Please ensure that P.E kit is in school every day, as it may be required for additional games activities and that **ALL KIT IS NAMED**.



Reading

Reading is so important and it is vital that the children read or are read to every day. Our expectation is that the children read for at least 20 minutes each day at home. Children need to record their reading in their diary and parents are to sign it at the end of each week. Reading diaries are collected in every Monday.



Homework

During the Spring term, the children will continue to have Maths homework every week. It is important that the children are organised in handing it in on time and completing it to the best of their ability. If they do not hand it in, they will completing it during their lunchtime. We are free most lunchtimes, so please encourage them to come and ask if there is a problem. Homework will be set on Friday to be in for the following Wednesday.

Mobile phones

Please ensure that if your child has a phone, you are checking your child's phones regularly. Just a reminder that the age restriction for Whatsapp is 16, so no child in Year 5 should be using the app and setting up group chats. Uniform

Please ensure that your child is dressed smartly and always has the correct uniform on. School shoes are to be worn and not trainers. Long hair needs to be tied back. No jewellery is to be worn. If you have any questions, please ask.



Attendance

It is vital that your child is in school every day and only off if they are really unwell. Children need to be punctual to school as we start learning as soon as the children arrive at **8.45am**.
