Reading

We have learned many new letter sounds in class now so your child should be able to identify some of these in their reading books while they are reading with you. In class we are working on segmenting letters and then blending them together to solve words, i.e. s-a-t... sat. It would be helpful for children to also practise this skill when reading at home. Please do make sure you are recording their reading in their reading record.



Reading Books and Book Bags

Please make sure reading books and reading records come into school every day. On Wednesdays we take the books and reading records in, and your child will receive new books to bring home on a Thursday.

Library books will be changed once a week. Library and 'Love to read!' books are for you to enjoy with your child; you may like to read to or with them.

Attendance

It is vital that your child is in school every day and only off if they are really unwell.

Children need to be punctual to school as we start learning as soon as the children arrive at **8.45am**. Any child arriving after 9.00am has already missed 15 minutes learning and often feel anxious as everyone else is already in class and has started their learning for the day.
