Dear parents and carers,

In this week's Celebration of the Word assembly we heard the story from Matthew's Gospel where Jesus calls his first disciples. The fishermen were far from perfect and appeared ordinary but went on to do extraordinary things with Jesus leading them.


I told the children about one of my favourite saints (Damian of Molokai). He was a priest who did not excel at seminary school and was then sent to the remotest inhabited island in the world (Hawaii) as a missionary. When he arrived he realised that the King was ordering those with the infectious skin disease - leprosy - to be banished to one of the smaller islands (Molokai). Led by Jesus as his example and having already left his family and friends far behind he made the decision to go to the lepers.

Ask your children what happened next. Damian ends up giving his life for others and achieved the extraordinary. He was canonised in 2009.

Damian's sacrifice inspired others to follow and many more began arriving on the island of Molokai to help the lepers. I asked the children to think of ways in which we can inspire others to follow Jesus through making small sacrifices and putting the needs of others ahead of our own. Let's try to achieve the extraordinary by following Jesus' example.



Family Mass at St Joseph's






Saint of the week


Parents' Evening

Year 6 RE work




Clever Cleo!


Rocksteady rock stars!


- Lillie has started a new skill on the drums - crossing hands to play the 'hi hat cymbals'.




Readers of the week!

Reading







14 February - St Cyril
St. Cyril and his brother St. Methodius helped teach the Slavic people about God and made the first Slavic alphabet called Glagolitic. They also translated the Bible so people could read it in their own language. Today, St. Cyril is remembered for helping people learn to read and for creating the Cyrillic alphabet.

10 February - St Scholastica
St. Scholastica, twin sister of St. Benedict, devoted her life to God and led a community of women. She is remembered for her deep faith and prayer, including a famous story where God sent a storm so she could spend more time with her brother.

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
