Audiobooks


Children listening to stories is extremely valuable. One way children might do this is through audiobooks.

Reading diaries

It is vital that children are reading at home. In KS1, children bring home their phonics book, 'love to read' book and library book. Please ensure you are reading to your child every day.

In KS2, children have reading diaries. Children should be reading for 20 minutes every day. They need to record their reading in their diaries and we ask parents to sign the diaries at the end of each week. Reading diaries are collected in every Monday to monitor how much the children are reading. The children will receive bronze, silver and gold badges ad certificates when they have read a certain amount of times.

Bronze - 50 reads Silver - 100 reads Gold - 200 reads



What can my child read?

There are so many genres that children can be reading and recording in their diaries. It is really important that the children read a wide range of genres and authors. The children can read the following:

- fiction book
- non-fiction book
- comic
- graphic novel
- magazine
- recipe
- poetry
- newspaper
- leaflet

KS₁


