Well done to all the children for a brilliant start to the Autumn term. Everyone has settled in really well to their new classes. I am very proud of the children. It was wonderful to see parents and grandparents at our KS1 Harvest Liturgy. We also celebrated our Anniversary Mass with our new Priest, Father Paul.

We have some exciting things happening at school including the conversion of our former ICT suite into a Phiz Lab - a dedicated science lab providing our pupils with access to a practical and engaging science curriculum. Our Science Lead, Mrs Walls, is leading the project and we will be holding an official opening once it is complete! We will notify you when we have a date confirmed.

We are delighted to report that during the summer Mrs Walls visited the The Large Hadron Collider (LHC) - the world's largest and most powerful particle accelerator at CERN, in Switzerland. Mrs Walls visited the NASA space station project control room, the anti matter factory, the flash proton therapy project where they are developing flash therapy for cancer treatment in hospitals and lots of other amazing things. She will be bringing all of her new knowledge back to St Joseph's to inspire the children during their science lessons.

# LEARNING

#### Year 2

Year 2 have been carrying out some excellent art work using various materials and artistic skills and techniques. They have imprinted on polystyrene tiles and then painted over these to make their own prints of maps. Their artwork is focused on being abstract pieces based on maps. They had a fantastic time carrying out this and the results were amazing as you can see!!



Year 2 are also enjoying designing and describing monsters as part of their learning about the main characters as they read their latest text, 'Not Now Bernard'! There were some very creative ideas as they worked in groups!! They are engrossed in the text and have learnt more about the main character Bernard and the Monster. They will continue this text after half term.





In Maths Year 2 have continuing their learning from Year 1 regarding Place Value. The children have been counting in 2's, 5's and 10's, using number lines and partitioning numbers. Working in pairs, the children showed various representations of two digits numbers using different resources.





### Year 4

Year 4 are taking part in a BCP Clean Air Project, just one of several projects running in BCP which will help to improve air quality. Air pollution is an issue that is of increasing concern, especially around schools. One of the main contributors to poor air quality is motorised vehicles. At drop off and pick up times air pollution outside and around schools significantly worsens as a large number of vehicles gather at the same time. Often cars are needlessly left idling, significantly impacting the quality of the air.

The Clean Air Schools pilot is working with six local schools to teach children and their families about how the way we travel can influence how clean our air is. Activities include classroom workshops, idling counts and science investigations.

Here are St Joseph's we have placed four diffusion tubes around school. These will be taken and analysed at a science lab.

Some of the Year 4 children have been out before school carrying out an idling count to see how many engines are left on. Our results will be given after half term.





#### Year 6

Year 6 had a lovely school trip to Hengistbury Head at the beginning of October. As part of their geography, they have been learning about coastal features and how they are formed, as well as erosion, all of which they were able to spot whilst there. They were extremely sensible all day, enjoying the short ferry journey and creating some natural art on the beach before the end of the day.
