# LEARNING

### Ducklings

Ducklings have had a great start to our school life. They have learnt about seasonal changes; they started their Talk for Writing learning with 'We're going on a Bear Hunt' and they have learnt about repeated patterns in our Maths lessons. They also started their Forest School sessions and they even had marshmallows this week. Well done, Ducklings. We are all super proud of you!







### Year 1

Year 1 loved designing and building these lovely working windmills this half term! The windmills even have a pipe cleaner handle to turn the sails. Thank you so much to all of the parents who came to see our work at our D.T. exhibition.





### Year 2

Year 2 have really enjoyed their science topic this half term, they have loved looking for minibeasts around the school. They found lots of different creatures and explore their microhabitats. Year 2 have also loved Forest School this half term! They were especially excited to toast marshmallows around a fire.





### Year 3

We have had a great first term in Year 3 and have thrown ourselves back in time to the Stone Age. In the 3rd week we went to Cranborne Ancient Technology Centre and learned what life was like for Stone Age man by emersing ourselves in activities they would have done on a daily basis: knapping flint that would be used to make tools and weapons for hunting, grinding grain to make flour for bread and willow weaving to make fences to keep animals in when they started farming. Our art has also been pre-historic. We have explored different ways Stone Age man would have made marks on the walls of caves that can still be seen 1,000s of year later using natural materials like grass, berries, mud and spices. These were used for colour, texture and glue. Sticks, feathers, cones and stones were useful for using as brushes or to grind the materials to produce colour. We made our own textured paper to represent the cave wall and painted animals using earthy tones characteristic of the materials that would have been available at the time.







# LEARNING

### Year 4

Year 4 have made a great start to the Autumn term with their weekly swimming lessons. They have been making excellent progress and it is great to see their confidence growing each week. In history, Year 4 have been learning about the Mayan civilisation. The children were interested to learn that most of our favourite foods we eat today, such as chocolate, were discovered and developed centuries ago by the Mayans.

In science, Year 4 have been learning about endangered species and studying invertebrates - the children even did an invertebrate hunt and studied them under the microscope. The class has been reading 'The Last Bear' by Hannah Gold and learning about life in the Arctic circle.

### Year S



Year 5 have enjoyed talking about careers in space and astronomy. The class watched a video from Dr Fawcett about her journey to becoming an astronomer, what an astronomer does, and what she researches - black holes and active galaxies.

Year 5 also designed and created playgrounds as part of their Design and Technology project. The playgrounds all looked great! Thank you to the parent helpers for coming in and supporting the children.



### Year 6

This half-term, Year 6 have been learning about The Tudors. Last week, they had a fantastic day at Hampton Court Palace exploring where King Henry VIII lived. Year 6 loved seeing lots of different rooms in the palace, visiting the Tudor kitchens, walking through the maze and seeing a real tennis court. They had an excellent workshop called Investigating Henry, where they showed off their knowledge so far and learned a lot too. The Year 6 team who accompanied the children on the trip were so impressed with their outstanding behaviour, but loved seeing the awe and wonder on their faces throughout the day. One child said, "I can't believe we're walking the same steps that Henry VIII took." Thank you to Mrs Holmes, who helped secure funding, to make this trip possible.


