Dear Parents and Carers,

The Spring Term has been full of exciting opportunities for all our pupils, despite all the illnesses going around and the wet weather. We have had the Science Fair, Space Camp, the Clean Air Project, Science Dome, Forest School for KS1, bedtime reading evening in school, Rocksteady's Concert and visits to Upton House Country Park. Children in Key Stage 2 have also been learning violin, ukulele and recorder. It was wonderful to walk with the children and parents to Highcliffe Castle in the sunshine on Sunday and raise funds for our Crowdfunder. This term, we have continued our drive on encouraging the children to read regularly at home, receiving badges and certificates for their hard work. We welcomed parents in to visit our wonderful library, we have run phonics 'learn with your child' sessions for parents in Ducklings class and Year 1. We are continuing to promote reading for pleasure across the school – studies show that reading benefits the following:


- Reading attainment and writing ability;
- Text comprehension and grammar;
- Breadth of vocabulary;
- Positive reading attitudes;
- Greater self-confidence as a reader;
- Pleasure in reading in later life;
- General knowledge;
- A better understanding of other cultures;
- Community participation; and
- A greater insight into human nature and decision-making.

Reading to your child has a positive impact on their learning, vocabulary and imagination - please take time to visit the local library with your child over the Easter holidays. We also have lots of dyslexia-friendly books for children so do talk to your child's teacher if you need extra reading books at home.

In our end of term assembly today, we shared the story, 'The Garden, The Curtain and the Cross' - it helps to explain Easter to the children and the message is, 'Thank you, King Jesus - you're amazing!'. For Holy Week this week, we had prayer stations in the hall and the children were wonderful -

very prayerful, engaged and helping each other. A huge well done to the children and thank you to the staff team for their amazing work this term. Thank you for your support and all you do to work in partnership with us.

#### Country Park learning

Following a successful funding application for educational workshop sessions, Years 2-6 visited Upton Country Park on separate days in February and March for a series of curriculum related workshops:

- Year 6 Poetry in the Park (Literacy) & Art in Nature (Art)
- Year 5 Romans (History) & Art in Nature (Art)
- Year 4 Maps & Measures (Geography and Maths) & Firepit
- Year 3 Nature Paints (Art) & Collecting Light (Science)
- Year 2 Nature Day (Science) & Art in Nature (Art)

The children were led by a member from Upton and a team of volunteers and explored the grounds. They learned about the history of the park and the family who established it. The quality of learning and activities was excellent and very engaging for children of all levels of ability and background. All chosen sessions were linked with the children's learning in class and was a great opportunity to stretch what they knew and shine in a different environment. There was also time for lots of fun! Thank you Upton Country Park for five wonderful days of outdoor learning.



## LEARNING

#### Ducklings

Ducklings really enjoyed their Forest school sessions this term. They have been learning about minibeasts, learning how to survive and make shelters and last week they have learnt how to start a fire using a flint stone. Well done Ducklings for your excellent attitude to learning.





#### Year 1

This term Year 1 have learned so many new skills in Forest School! Our Forest School Leader Stephanie recently taught Year 1 how to tie lots of different knots and they are looking forward to using these skills in future D.T. lessons!





#### Year 2

Mr Curran says: Year 2 have had a busy term. Some of the highlights were carrying out some fantastic and visually grabbing art when colour mixing.





In addition, the children also enjoyed carrying out some Design and Technology looking at structures, in the making of Baby Bear's Chair! We would like to thank the volunteering adults - we couldn't have done it without you!

We had some members of Y2, aka 'Girl Power' perform the song, 'Best Day of My Life' by the band, American Authors. They were absolutely fantastic and showed off what they had learnt as part of their Rocksteady weekly lessons!

Year 2 took part in the Clean Air for Schools project and completed a balloon chart about the breathing in of clean air.

On the evening of World Book Day, Year 2 heard some stories read to by Mr Curran with the fire in the background keeping them all warm. The parents joined the children in class whilst they heard some stories, 'Perfectly Norman' and 'Dragon Post'. They also enjoyed a hot chocolate and digestive biscuits. Year 2 learnt from Mary who taught about rail safety and how to stay safe around our local tracks and never to walk through a barrier when they are coming down and the alarm is sounding.

Year 2 also enjoyed the Planetarium with Year 1 when it visited from Winchester Science Centre. This learning also reinforced what knowledge they gained from their Space unit and time spent during Space Camp.

Upton Country Park was a highlight from this past term. The children enjoyed time creating art using nature's offerings as well as tree hugging and learning about how plants grow. The children sequenced the life cycle of a tree. Even though it was wet, it was a great day. We even managed to squeeze some time in for a play in the park.





Year 2 have also been thoroughly enjoyed their Forest School days. Unfortunately, this is the last term that they will have this and we would like to thank Stephanie for leading these sessions.

Year 2 have learnt about mud and made self-portraits using mud, carved pencils from strips of wood, learnt how to tie different types of knots, toasted marshmallows by the fire, created coloured bookmarks using nature's colours and even became official fire starters when making fire themselves using some now-known techniques! It was such an enhancing experience and broadened the children's experiences.





### LEARNING

#### Year 3

Year 3 were very excited to welcome their parents into school on Wednesday to share their learning on ancient Egypt. In history the children were working towards answering the question 'What was life like in ancient Egypt?' and their artwork this term was leading towards the children making scrolls using an ancient technique. They then produced some artwork based on their studies of ancient Egyptian art. Year 3 finished the afternoon with story time and a chocolate.

#### Year 4







Mrs Wasmuth says: Well done to Year 4 for a fantastic Spring Term of learning. For Literacy we wrote a Horrid Henry story, including speech.

The children did a fantastic job and were able to use their vivid imaginations and apply to Horrid Henry and friends! In Maths the children have been learning about Length and Perimeter with Mrs Corallo and multiplying by 10, 100, and 1000, factors and multiples, bus stop division and fractions with Mrs Wasmuth. Times tables up to 12 remain an important focus for Year 4.

A highlight of the term for Year 4 was our school trip to Upton Country Park. In the morning the class split into two groups and learnt about Maps and Measures. We explored the Park and looked for clues to solve a puzzle. In the afternoon we made fire (safely!)

As a class, in small groups we listened to the fire safety talk from the Park Ranger then chopped wood and attempted to light a small fire. We were very proud of the mature and sensible attitude all the children demonstrated and they were fantastic ambassadors for St Joseph's. Huge thank you to the adult helpers who came on the day.

#### Year S

On March 7th, Year 5 had a fantastic day of science as they took part in the Road to RIAT STEM Challenge with the subject of Space delivered virtually by the Smallpeice Trust.

Generously funded by and delivered in partnership with the RAF Charitable Trust, the RAF and Accenture, the virtual workshop started with a hands-on project working in teams to design, build and test their creations. In the afternoon, the children took part in an activity, challenging students to design a sustainable aircraft of the future. Thank you to the Smallpiece Trust for a super day of STEM!

#### Year 6

Year 6 had a fantastic day at Upton Country Park, where they enjoyed creating art in nature and writing their own poems, as well as exploring the grounds there and making the most of being outside for the day. Unfortunately in class, the Year 6 chairs quit for the day and the children had to work without them. Although they thought this fun to begin with, they soon realised their chairs were vital in helping with their learning. They wrote persuasive letters to the chairs and luckily, they came back.



#### Sport

We took pupils from Years 3 and 4 to a Fair Play Tag Rugby development tournament at Chapel Gate. The children enjoyed an hour of coaching as well as five games against other schools. They all enjoyed learning how to play as a team and learning skills of tag rugby. Well done everyone!

### Rocksteady Concert







#### Science Week

# LoveReading4Kids donates 25% of every order to schools

At St Joseph's reading for pleasure is very important and we love to have a well stocked library for our children to enjoy. We have applied for funding via the LoveReading4Kids Funding For Schools Scheme to buy more books for our school. As we wait for a decision, we can receive donated funds with LoveReading4Kids when a customer or our school community purchases books from <a href="loveReading4kids.co.uk">loveReading4kids</a> when you buy a book you can allocate 25% of what you spend to our school! This will be donated by LoveReading4Kids. The balance is then added to our school dashboard and we can purchase books for our school library.

#### Holidays during term time

A reminder that under the guidance of BCP, all unauthorised holidays and absences of 5 days or more taken during term time will result in a Fixed Penalty Notice. The fine is £60 per child, per parent if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice; rising to £120 if paid within 28 days. #### Improving mental health



The Somerford Arc is delighted to announce its brand new, Somerford based 'Creative Wellbeing' programme for parents and carers. Please see details below:

Where: The Arc, Southey Road, Somerford. BH23 3EH

When: Monday's, 1-3pm, starting Monday 15th April

Who: Open to all adults.

What: A calm, happy couple of hours for anyone who wants to get out of the house and improve their mental health by relaxing and being creative in a safe, non-judgmental environment. This is a free service provided by Coda (Backed by lottery funding) with the intention to improve the mental health of the local community in Somerford and the wider Christchurch area.

#### Measles - protect your child

Measles is currently a growing issue nationally after seeing large increases in London and the West Midlands.

#### What can I do?

MMR vaccination is the best form of defence against measles and has the added advantage of also preventing rubella and mumps. Over 90% of individuals will have protection against measles mumps and rubella after the first dose of the MMR vaccines currently used in the UK. A single dose of measlescontaining vaccine is at least 95% effective in preventing clinical measles. After a second dose of measles-containing vaccine protection increases to well above 95%.

It is never too late to catch up. The MMR vaccine is free on the NHS and can be accessed via GP surgeries.


