


PTA Update - fundraising success and Summer Fayre

What an amazing day KS2 children at St Joseph's had on Friday 3rd March. Keith Cox, from Bloc Digital, visited school and introduced the children to a whole new world of technology that they had never heard of, or experienced, before.

They were able to wander through a newly designed house and swim under the ocean with turtles and jellyfish using VR tecnology. They drew all over the hall in 3D with augmented reality and explored the planets in a mixed reality world. The awe and wonder the tech created that you could see on their faces was joyful to see.

Our library makeover





Reading is so important to us at St. Joseph's and we want to foster a love of reading in the children. We are very fortunate having a library in school. For the past few months, it has been undergoing a complete makeover, with new furniture and lots of new books. Our Year 6 librarians have been busy scanning all of the books into our new software, Libresoft.

We hope to have the library open to the children again after Easter and hope it will be a place where they will want to come and read books. How Big is My Problem?



Emergency
